- 1. The Vikings (Viking heritage) The Vikings developed the trade in the North of Europe during the Middle Ages.
- 2. Greta Thunberg, the young activist that fights global warming.
- 3. Breughel, a great Belgian painter
- **4.** The Grieving Parents from Käthe Kollwitz? (Heritage '14-'18) The First World War changed Europe. Käthe Kollwitz was a German artist and pacifist.
- 5. Boris Johnson, The United Kingdom left the European Union under Boris Johnson (Brexit).
- **6. Shakespeare**, (Renaissance heritage, 15th -16th century) A great writer for theater.
- 7. **Newton** (Heritage of the Age of Enlightenment, 18th century). Mankind rethinks the world, science, the management of men and nation.
- **8.** The citizens defend the nation (Heritage of the French Revolution of 1789) With the French Revolution (1789), new ideas are put in place. It is no longer the noble that defend the king or emperor, but the citizens that defend the nation.
- **9.** Catherine de Médicis. (Heritage of the Renaissance) This period was named Renaissance because Europe discovers the Greek-Roman culture and uses it as inspiration to rethink the place of mankind in the world.
- **10. Afonso Henriques**. (medieval heritage), Afonso Henriques fights the Arabs in Spain and creates Portugal.
- **11. Don Quixote** (Heritage of the Renaissance) This character by Cervantes was a masterpiece in the European literature.
- **12. Christopher Colombus**, the first European to discover America in 1492. This is the time of grand discoveries.
- **13. Galileo**. During the Renaissance, Galileo discovers that the Earth revolves around the Sun, and not the opposite. He experiments with the fact that all bodies are attracted to the Earth in the same way. This is gravity.
- **14.** The crane that destroys the Berlin Wall in 1989. The eastern countries liberate themselves from the Soviet empire. Much of these countries will join the European Union in 2004, 2007 et 2013.
- **15.** Martin Luther (Christian heritage) In 1517 he publishes the foundations of the Protestantism.
- **16. Builders of the Roman roads**. (Roman heritage) Europe is strongly inspired by the Roman culture, mostly because of the Roman empire that existed until 476.
- 17. Preseren, A great Slovenian writer.
- **18. The Ariane rocket,** We find ourselves in South-America and yet this region is part of the European Union, just as the other overseas French departments.
- **19. Odysseus** (Greek heritage) Odysseus attached himself to the mast to avoid being attracted by the sirens. The Greek culture is the start of the typical European culture.
- **20.** Caryatid, These are pillars in the shape of women.
